Wow! What a great turnout for our meeting on Wednesday, 13 Jul 2022 in Savannah, GA at the Hyatt Regency Hotel. This was held during the National Society Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR) Congress in Savannah.

As Grand Viscount General of The Order of the Founders of North America, I was honored to bring greetings on behalf of the OFNA at

the opening ceremony of the NSSAR Congress on Tuesday morning, 12 Jul 2022. I was one of several heads of national organizations to bring greetings to the members of the NSSAR.

At the meeting, the proposed amendment to the bylaws that had previously been distributed to the membership was voted on. You may remember that this proposal to change the bylaws dealt with using applications from other societies as documentation without further documentary evidence. After some discussion, this proposal was passed with one nay vote.

At the inception of our organization, then Grand Viscount General Ed Butler, asked fellow Founder David Appleby to register our Society. Being a resident of and lawyer in Missouri, he registered the society in the state of Missouri. He has kept up with our registration over the years at no cost to the OFNA. At his request, I have contacted Missouri Registered Agents LLC about becoming our registered agent. At the meeting, we voted to approve Missouri Registered Agents, LLC to be our agent. The current price for them to represent us will be \$152.00 per year.

After some discussion about what 501c3 organization we would donate to this year, it was suggested that I assign a committee of three members to make that determination. I was fortunate to have three members volunteer to serve on that committee – past GVG Lindsey Brock, past GVG Ed Butler, and Exchequer General Tom Jackson. I then appointed Tom Jackson as the Chairman. They are tasked with bringing a proposed organization to the OFNA at our next meeting in Louisville, KY in September/October, to then be voted on by the membership.

Our next meeting will be at the NSSAR Trustees/ Leadership meeting in Louisville, KY and is tentatively planned for Saturday, 1 Oct 2022. We will plan on having another Zoom meeting on Sunday, 13 Nov 2022 at 7:00 pm Eastern Time Zone.

Help pass the word about our Society. We can always use new members to help grow our Society. Our Secretary General and Genealogista General are hard at work bringing in new members. We had several guests and prospective members at our meeting in Savannah. If you know of anyone who would qualify for membership, encourage them to join our organization.

Hereditary Society Community of the United States of America

The Hereditary Society Community of the United States of America ("HSC") is a non-profit organization, founded in 2002, which conveys the public interface for over 300 lineage societies. HSC's primary mission is to facilitate and increase the community's aggregate focus on genealogical accuracy; access to information and research tools; accurate public listing of contact data non-partisan civic outreach; historical education; scholarship; and fraternity and collegiality between organizations. The organization meets every April, in Washington, D.C., for an annual meeting and gala event.

America lineage societies have existed since the colonial period, and have provided avid genealogists and historians focused opportunities to study specific aspects of American history in juxtaposition with research into their own families. Prior to HSC, efforts to index the aggregate data related to American lineage societies included Bailey Banks and Biddle's (1917) American Orders & Societies and Their Decorations, John Griffin Richardson Rountree's (1970-1983) publication, The Hereditary Register, as well as a brief publication in the 1990s, The Hereditary Society Blue Book.

Catalyzed by the considerable deficit of any indexed publication, or viable knowledge management platform, several key leaders in the wider lineage society community founded HSC. Their primary focus, at that time, was to increase synergy within the burgeoning community of disparate groups, as well as to provide a means to transition modern lineage societies and their members toward more equitable outcomes. The organization has maintained its commitment to inclusiveness and diversity, and a consistent focus on making the study of genealogy relevant to the widest array of the population. The organization was incorporated in October, 2002, and held its first formal meeting in April, 2003 at the Washington Club at Dupont Circle.


